4.	The author creates a sense of suspense. List at least 2 quotes that from the story that contribute to this feeling for the reader.
5.	Why is Tom upset about the loss of the paper? Select two cd's from the text that support your opinion.
6.	Tom experiences a second conflict. Is it internal or external? Select a quote that shows this conflict.

7.	Anxiety and uncertainty create suspense. Select one cd (not used in #6) that shows Tom's Anxiety and uncertainty and explain why it is a good example.
8.	Use evidence from the text to show Tom's willingness to take risks.
9.	Describe the pace of the passage. How do you think this contributes to the feeling of the suspense?
