



PLOT CONCEPTS


Exposition = presents main characters who want something or have a problem

- Internal Conflict = struggle within the character
 man vs. self
- External Conflict = outside sources creates conflict:
 - man vs. man, man vs. nature, man vs. society, man vs. supernatural, man vs. fate

Complications/Rising Action = series of new problems/conflicts for the characters

Climax = turning point, outcome of conflict decided Resolution = an insight or change as a result of the conflict...they all lived happily ever after.

SEQUENCING AND TIME MANIPULATION

Chronological Order = events told as they happened Flashback = present action jumps to a past event Flash forward = present action jumps to a future event Foreshadowing = a clue about the future

POINT OF VIEW

The vantage or perspective point from which a story is told.

- First person
 - Narrator is part of the action...me, I, we
 - We only know what the narrator sees and knows
- Third Person= narrator is outside the action
 - Omniscient= all knowing
 - Limited= tells only the thoughts and feelings of one character.



SUSPENSE


A sense of uncertainty as the story's conflict rises. Withholding details or hinting at events to come.


