Integrated Math 2 satisfies the A-G requirements towards math for the CSU and UC for college and career preparedness. This student centered course is the second of a 3 course program integrating algebra and geometry topics in an effort to prepare students for post high school mathematics. Successful completion of the 3 integrated courses satisfies high school requirements for Bonita Unified and the state of California. The prerequisite course is Integrated Math 1. The following 12 chapters will be explored during this course:

- Exploring Algebraic and Geometric Relationships
- Justification and Similarity
- Probability and Trigonometry
- Factoring and More Trigonometry
- Quadratic Functions
- More Right Triangles
- Proof and Conditional Probability
- Polygons and Circles
- Modeling with Functions
- Circles and More
- Solids
- Counting and Closure

This course relies heavily on **collaboration** and **communication** between students. Students will be working in groups with specific roles to facilitate their understanding of mathematical topics in an exploratory manner. Although collaboration is used during the learning process, students are individually assessed and held accountable for their learning by participating and completing all assignments and homework.

#### A note to the parents/guardians:

I often have parents ask how they can help their students be successful in High School Math when they may not understand the math. First, your student is a few years away from graduation, so encourage them to start advocating for themselves when they need help or are concerned with their progress in a class. Dear students,

I have very high expectations for you. I believe in you. I think you are very capable of learning the math in this course. I do not believe that there are people who are "math people" and "not-math people". You are all capable of learning this material and working with a team. Instead of thinking, "Oh, I will never understand this, I've always been bad at math" think instead "this is challenging, but I am going to keep trying".

There are some expectations I have for your behavior in this class. You all have a right to an education. When a student talks out of turn, is off task, etc., that student is infringing on the rights of his or her classmates to learn. I take this kind of infraction very seriously.

In order to ensure that every student has an opportunity to learn I want you to know the following 5 things:

- 1. We are a community of learners. This includes the teacher (yes, I am still learning).
- 2. Please, if you know an answer to a question, do not call out the answer right away. This interferes with others who are still thinking about the question. If you figure an answer before others, double check your work, or try to see if you can solve it another way. Also, make sure you can defend your answer.
- 3. There is no such thing as a "math" person. You are capable of learning this. You just have to keep trying.
- 4. In this class, we use academic language to explain our thought process, we show our work as a way to provide evidence of our thinking, we ask questions when something is unclear, and we keep trying.
- 5. Math is fun. It's also hard work, but it's mostly fun and worthwhile.

I look forward to an amazing school year and I hope you enjoy our time together this school year.
