₩ BHS ABSENCE / MAKEUP WORK POLICY

For all Non-School Business-related absences, students are given one additional day for submission of any assignments due on the date of the absence. Students are also given one additional day per day of absence to complete assignments given on the day of the absence, equalling the total number of days missed. For example, if a student misses three consecutive school days, then the student may submit assignments three school days from the day they returned to class.

For all School Business-related absences, students are required to submit assignments given prior to the absence on or before the deadline, even though the student will not be in class. If an assignment is given during the class in which the student is absent, the student is given an additional day to submit the assignment.

When a student misses an assessment, the time allotted for that student to make up the missed assessment will be dictated by the individual teacher, but in no case will a student be given more than one week to make up the missed assignment.

← COMMUNICATION POLICY →

In an effort to help students learn to advocate for themselves, students must speak to their English teacher regarding any absences, missed assignments, or other areas of concern. Students can ask to speak to the teacher directly or email them at their school email address. As students are becoming young adults in high school, it is important for students to learn how to advocate for their own needs.
