## A. STEP 1

1. Log into the student Aeries account
2. Click Classes
3. Click Course Request Entry
4. Look under Filter Courses

6. Click the course so that it shows under Course Requests
7. Choose $\mathbf{6}$ courses - students selecting Period $\mathbf{0}$ can take $\mathbf{7}$ courses

## **Important things to remember when completing the pre-registration.**

1. Students cannot drop or enroll in an elective class after the first two weeks of each semester. Level changes are permitted through the 7th week of the semester when seats are available.

3. If you are registering for any AP classes, please read the AP Application Form.
4. If you plan to register for summer school, indicate the course you would like to take, e.g., Gov/Econ, etc. (You must complete a separate summer online application later in March in order to register for summer school).

By enrolling in an Advanced Placement (AP) class, students are making a commitment to take a course equivalent to a first-year college course. Students and parents should be aware that expectations and demands will be much higher in an AP class than a regular class. Students need to decide their willingness and ability to meet the increased academic challenges, their willingness and ability to accommodate the time demands of the course(s) (other courses, athletics, activities, and work), and the level of support they have from family and friends. Once the student has made the commitment to take an AP class, it is expected that:

1. The student will remain in that class for the duration of the school year; dropping the class will require administrative approval.
2. The student will take the AP exam for that class.

Financial Aid-AP exams are expensive; they currently cost $\$ 100.00$ per exam. If a student meets the following criteria, they will only have to pay a reduced fee per exam:

- Student is eligible for educational benefits (formerly free and reduced lunch) (\$10.00 per exam)

By signing the on-line pre-registration form, the parent and student agree to the following:

- We understand that based on prior performance and/or available space, my pre-registration choice may be removed or changed.
- We understand that high expectations exist in AP classes including increased work demands, possible review sessions after school, on weekends and during spring break, especially during the two months preceding the exam.
- I understand that once enrolled in an AP class, my ability to change that class will be limited and may not be possible.
- I understand that I, the student, am agreeing to take the AP exam.
